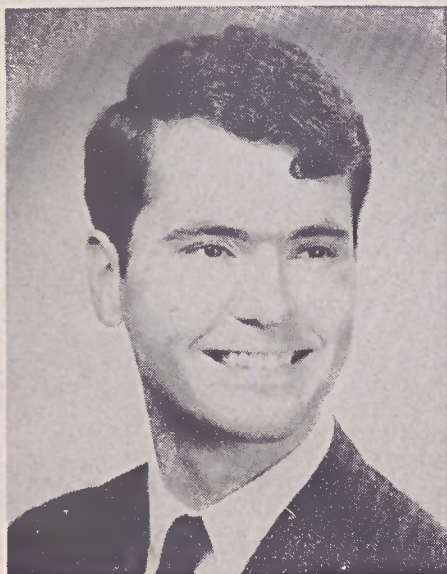


Employees' Sons Receive Degrees

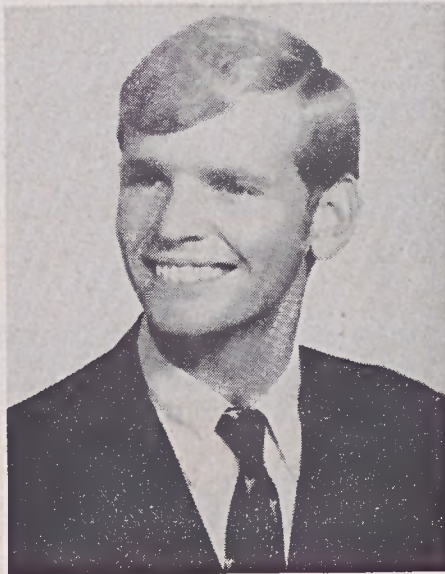

Prizes To Be Awarded For Waste Reduction At Karastan Spinning

To stimulate interest in the waste reduction program at Greenville for the remainder of the year, a special contest was launched July 28 to continue through September 21.

Officials at the Karastan Spinning Mill anticipate a successful second half in waste reduction and think that a new record in waste reduction will be established for the entire year of 1969.
