### McLawhon Assigned To Blanket Finishing Mill

The appointment of Allen P. (Pat) McLawhon, Jr., as a shift foreman in the Cutting and Sewing Department at the Blanket Finishing Mill has been announced, effective recently.

### Credit Union Will Pay Another 6% Dividend

Members of the Fieldcrest Mills Credit Union in all locations will receive a 6% per annum dividend, figured on their average monthly balances and credited to each member's share account as of June 30, 1972.

The dividend was authorized by the Credit Union's board of directors at their regular monthly meeting on Thursday, June 15.

The interest rate on Credit Union savings accounts was increased to 6% effective July 1, 1970. It previously was 5½% and has never been less than 4% since the organization of the Credit Union 14 years ago.
