Fieldcrest Employees Retire On January 1

Effective with this issue The Mill Whistle will resume publishing pictures of employees who retire under the Pension Plan. The first to appear are those who retired January 1, 1973. It Will not be feasible to go back and make good on any retirements prior to that date.

The Mill Whistle earlier carried pictures of retiring employees when normal retirement came on December 1 of each year. Publication of the pictures was then discontinued because it was impractical to obtain information and pictures of persons who took early retirement at odd times during the

Two developments have made it possible to resume publishing retirement pictures: (1) under the present procedure whereby employees retire the first of the month on or following their 65th birthday, information regarding retirements is readily available; and (2) most employees now have a recent picture in the files because of the employment identification system, therefore photographs of retirees are already on hand.

Hereafter, The Mill Whistle will carry the employee's identification picture when he or she retires unless a new picture is preferred. The pictures will normally be published during the month in which the employee retired.


