Five Complete 40 Years Service

Five Fieldcrest employees completed 40 years of continuous service with the Company in recent weeks. They are Andrew Fuller, Blanket Greige Mill; Beulah H. Graham, Fieldale Towel Mill; Jesse B. Patterson, Fieldale Towel Mill; Irene Tulloch, Bedspread Mill; and Eliza W. Voss, Sheet Finishing Mill.

Each long-service employee has received the Fieldcrest diamond-and-gold 40-year emblem, a \$40 gift certificate for Company merchandise and a letter of commendation from President William C. Battle.

Andrew Fuller, a maintenance mechanic at the Blanket Greige Mill, began employment on August 10, 1933, as a card feeder at the Blanket Greige Mill. He worked briefly at the Draper Sheeting Mill as a card feeder before going back to the Blanket Greige Mill as a finisher.

From 1940 until 1942, he worked at the old Woolen Mill as a finisher tender and then a card fixer. He returned to the Blanket Greige Mill as a weigher in the Wool Carding Department in 1942. He worked in various classifications in the Wool Carding Department before becoming a maintenance mechanic in 1969.

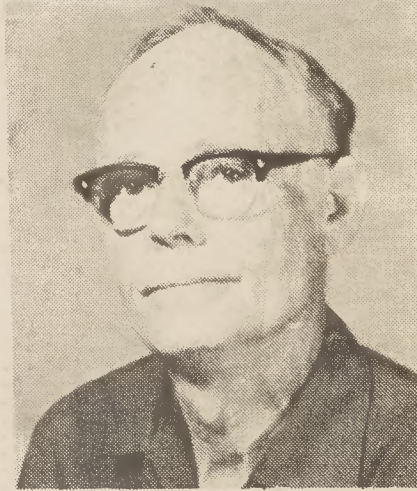

on August 14, 1933 as a looper in the Looping Department at the old Hosiery Mill. She went to the Cut and Sew Department at the Towel Mill in 1955 as a section inspector and terry reclaimer. She became a terry inspector in 1956 and a towels inspector in 1966.

Jesse Patterson, a winder operator titrator in the Piece Dyeing Department at the Fieldale Towel Mill, began employment on August 14, 1933 as a spinner in the Spinning Department.

He worked as a twister hand and a quiller in that department before moving to the Piece Dyeing Department in 1951 as a dye machine operator.

He worked in various classifications in the Piece Dyeing Department and as a second hand at the Bleach Department before becoming a winder operator titrator in 1966.

Irene Tulloch, a twister tender in the Twisting Department at the Bedspread Mill, began continuous service on August 14, 1933 as a winder in the Winding Department at that mill.

She became a cone winder hand in 1965 and a twister tender in 1970. She then worked as a winder tender in the Quilling Department before becoming a twister tender in the Twisting Department in 1971.

Eliza Voss, an inspector in the Sewing Department at the Sheet Finishing Mill, began employment on August 21, 1933 as a burler at the Karastan Mill. She went to the Finishing Mill Sewing Department in 1935 as a renovator.

From 1944 until 1951, she worked as an inspector-fold operator at the Synthetic Fabrics Mill, then returned to the Finishing Sewing Department where she worked as a spinner and reclaimer, inspector and checker and reclaimer before becoming an inspector-fold operator in 1962.
