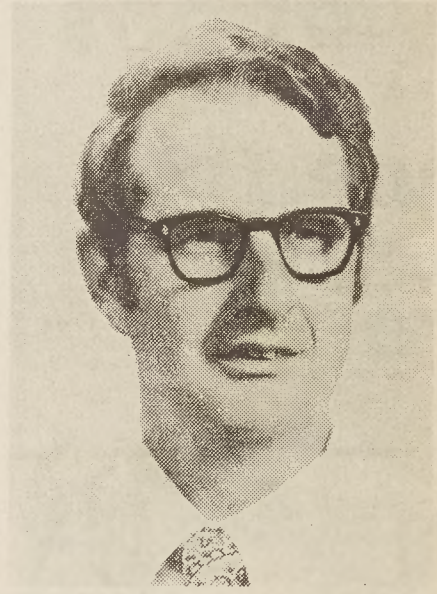


Organizational Changes Made

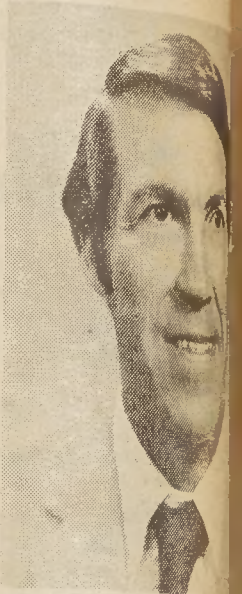

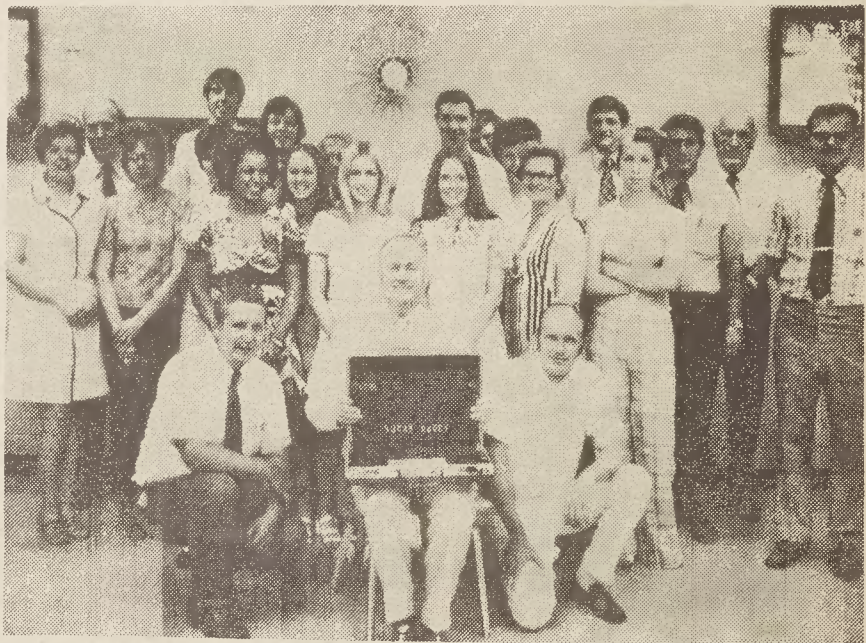

EXTRA DIVIDEND
