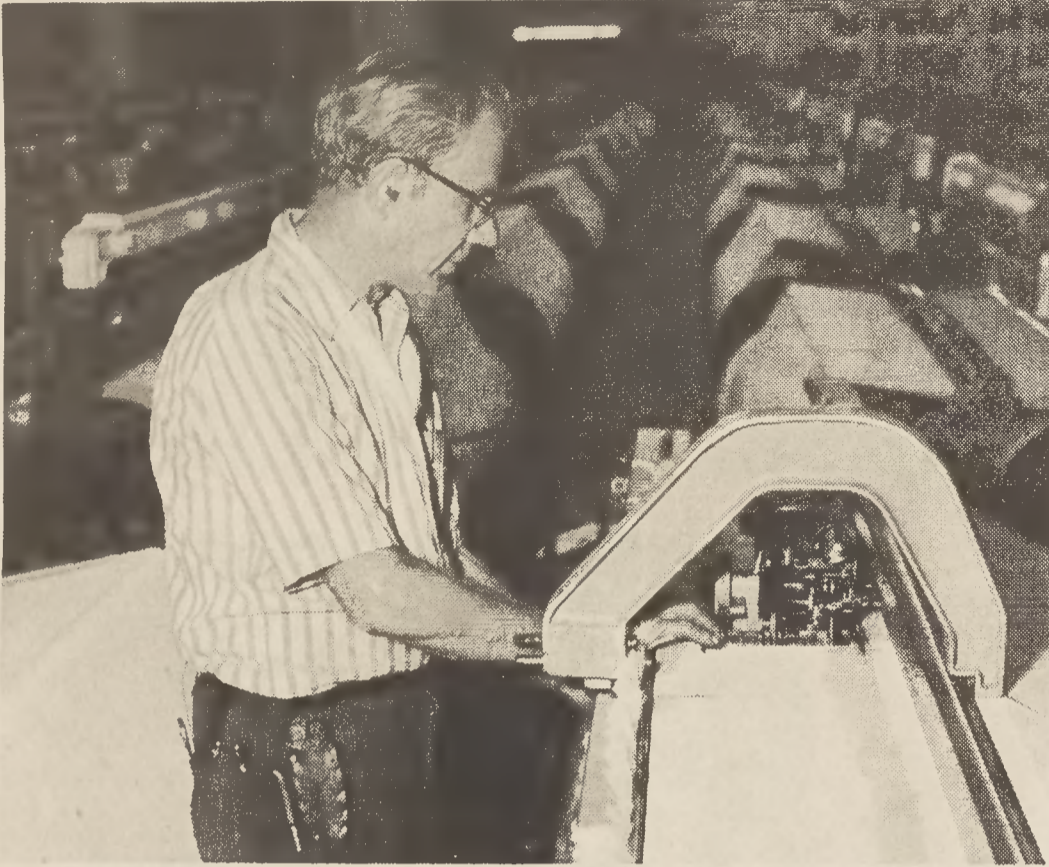


# People Make A Company

## Wed In August

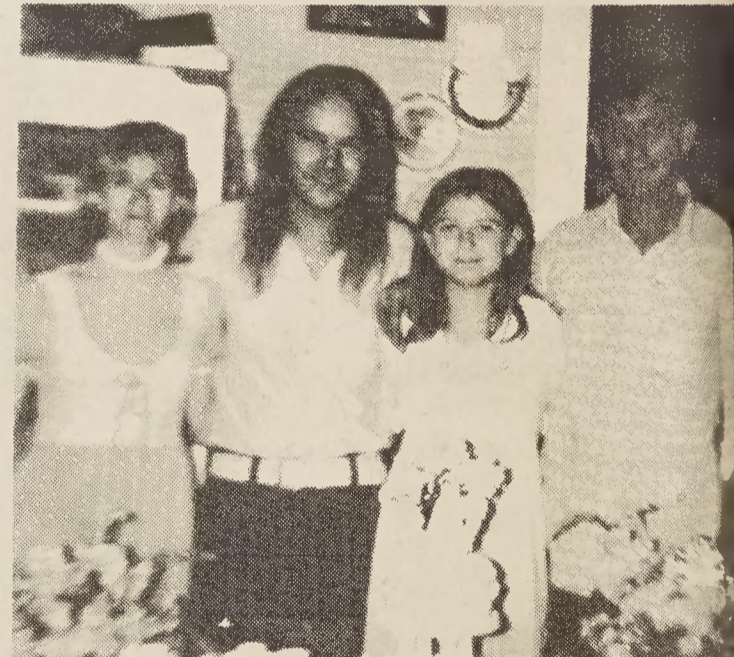


MRS. RICHARD O'PHARROW
