



Foremost Screen Print Employees Enjoy Safety Barbecue

Employees at the Foremost Screen Print Plant enjoyed a safety barbecue on October 9, in honor of achieving a total of

323,656 hours without a lost-time accident. They achieved an average of 2,087 man-hours per employee without a lost-time

injury, thereby qualifying for the safety barbecue. The last lost-time accident at Foremost prior to the barbecue was on

August 2, 1973.

Under the terms of the Fieldcrest Safety Contest, employees in any mill are eligible

for a safety barbecue when they achieve 2,000 average man-hours without a lost-time accident.

Two Months Old



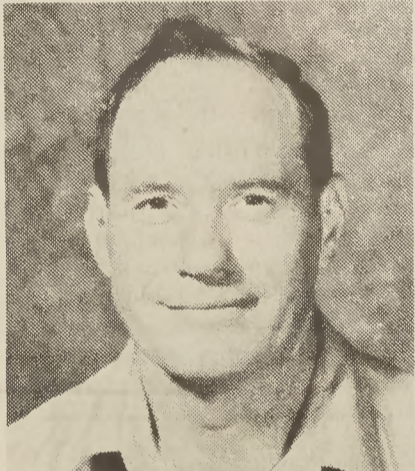

David Hutchins

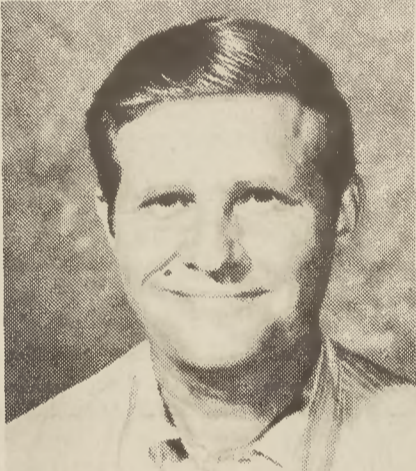

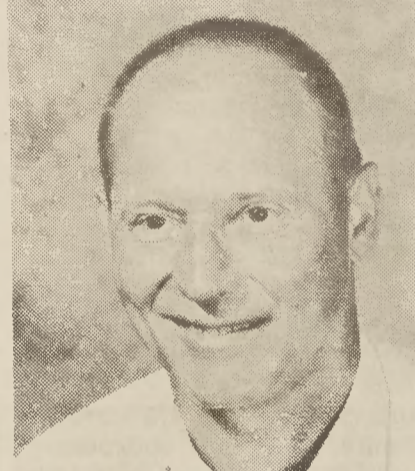
9 NCF Employees Complete IMC Supervisory Course



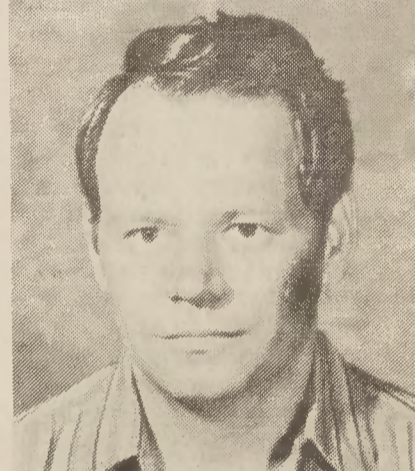

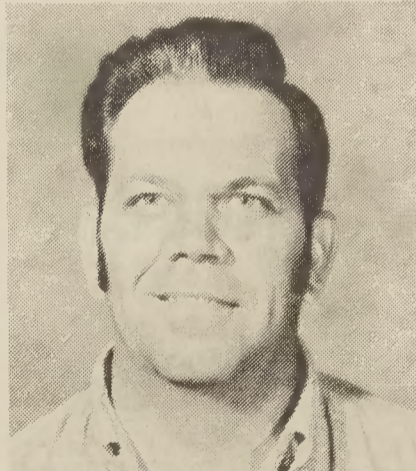

Nine NCF employees were among 15 graduates receiving Supervisory Development Diplomas at the Industrial Management Club (IMC) meeting held in September.

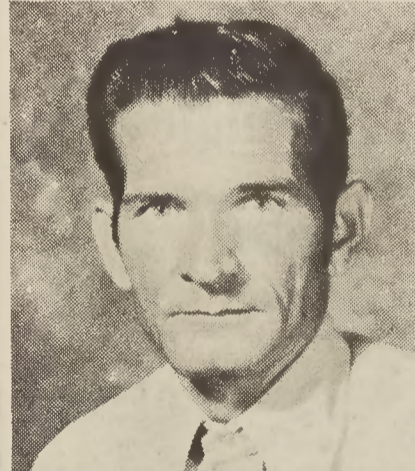

To complete the study, members are required to attend 13 required classes, seven elective classes, two seminars, and two plant tours. This means attending night classes at



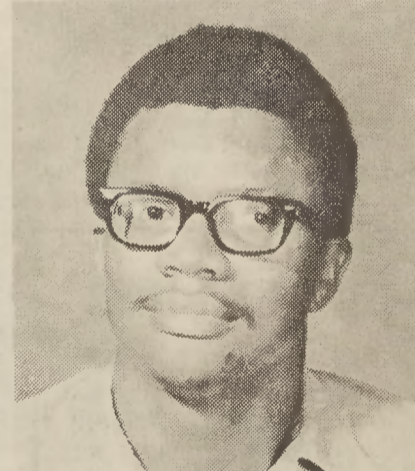
