Father And Son Share Golfer's Dream

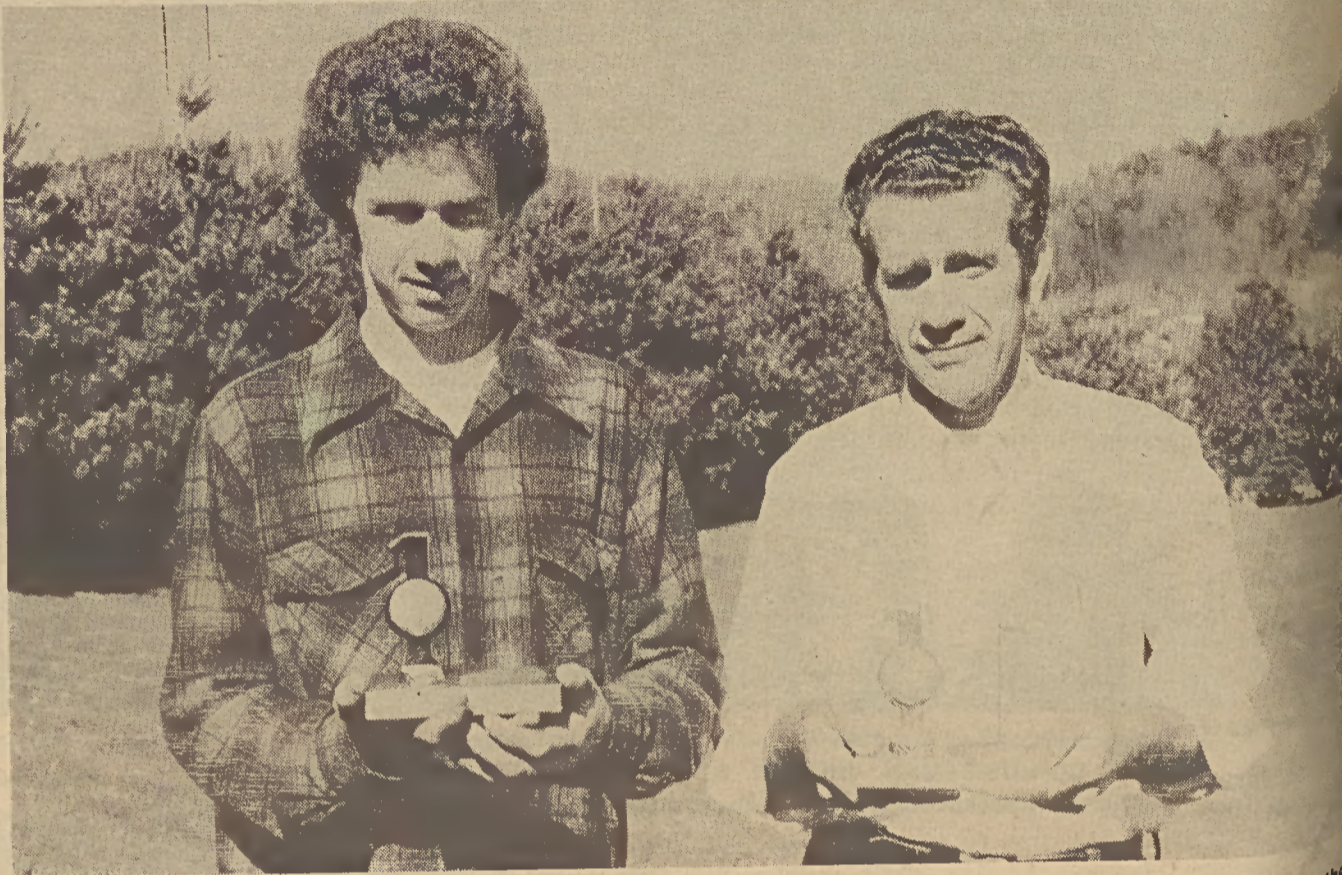
Two Fieldale employees, Tom Foley and his son, Tim, have had a golfer's dream come true.

Blue-Ribbon Project



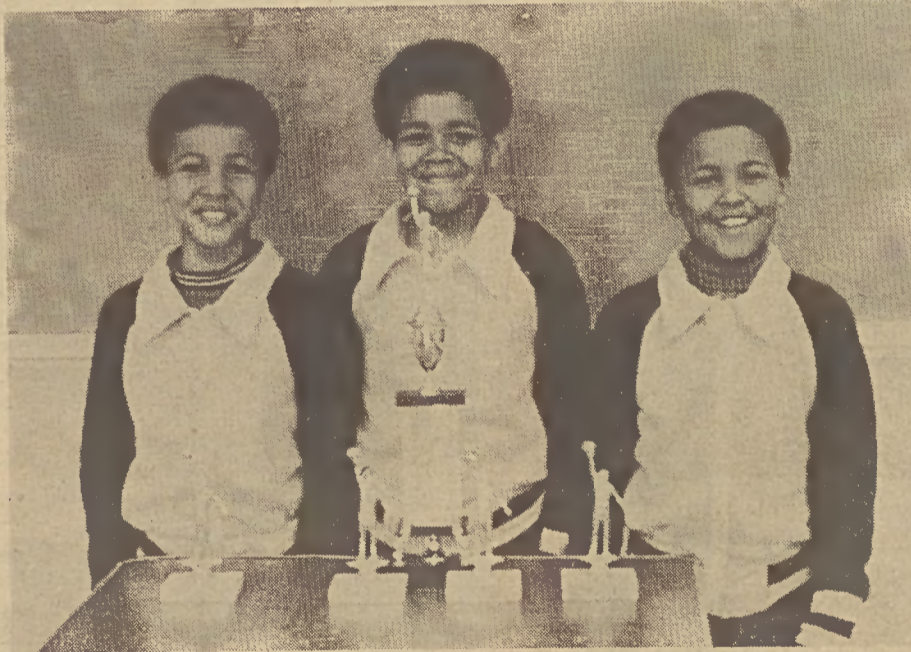
