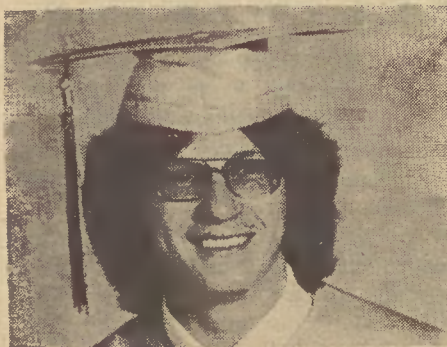
Tinsley Aids United Way
