A barbecue dinner was served to employees on all three shifts in recognition for their outstanding safety record.

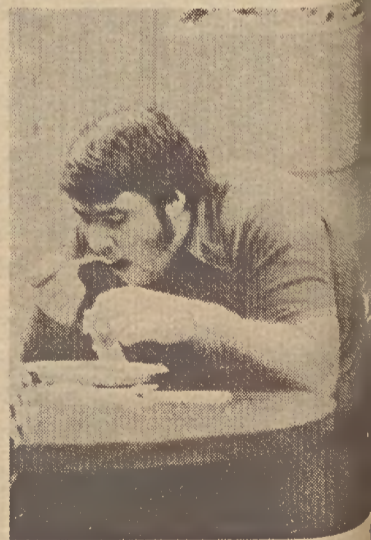
