
To be a Jones in this case, is to have taught English for twenty-four years. Now frankly, I'm having enough trouble with writing this one article, let alone teaching an English class!


We would like to recognize one of our newer members of the Montreat-Anderson teaching faculty: Mr. Martin Clark.


At first there weren't any openings.
