For several years now professors at Montreat-Anderson College have been searching for a way to justly reward these students. In September of 1989 Dr. Tisa Lewis began talking to various faculty members about implementing a plus/minus grading system. Simultaneously the SGA began discussing the same thing. When Dr. Lewis found this out, she asked me, as President of the SGA, to submit several options to the present grading system. Then, along with these options, Dr. Lewis took her

suggestions and presented them to the Academic Affairs Committee. The Committee looked over the various grading systems and decided to go with the plus/minus system. This grading scale was then presented to the faculty. After discussing it the faculty voted to adopt the plus/minus grading system for the next school year.

Professors hope that in the future students will be encouraged by the new grading system to give that extra effort. Each student should be aware that the use of this grading scale is the prerogative of each individual professor.
