"Gracie was our strongest and most consistent hitter," Bostic

said. "She batted cleanup for us. Also, Tari was our lead-off hitter and she got on base a lot and made things happen for us."

To show just how awesome the Lady Cavs were most of their games were called at the end of the fifth inning because of the 10-run rule. That rule states that if a team is leading by 10 runs at the end of the fifth inning the game was complete.

Jones was strong on the mound. She hurled eight shutouts which was a school record also.

"We had a lot of fun," Bostic said. "I think the girls deserve a lot of credit because they represented Montreat-Anderson College in a very positive manner."
