the Honor Code. These includelying, cheating, hazing, and stealing. Honor Court may give out harsh punishments, some of which may now be appealed. If you receive a punishment of disciplinary probation or higher, you may appeal it to the Administrative Committee. Smaller punishments like room restriction are final and may not be appealed.

As of today, April 6th, the M-AC baseball team stands at eight wins out of ten games played. This score shows the spirit and determination of the baseball team. Last week the baseball team defeated Lakeside College and Milligan College Jayvees (9-1 and 4-1 doubleheader).

In the defeat of Milligan College there were several highlights. Travis Poole, second baseman, had a hitting record of three for three, raising his batting average 60 points. During the second game Keith Allen only gave four hits, walked three and struck out seven hitters.
