dent, president of the Student Government Association and his perform-

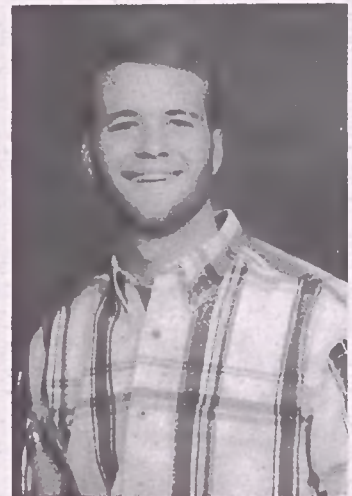
