### - Belk A 24 Hour Study Center?

Last Wednesday night, SGA member Jeff Reardon was overheard telling a faculty member that he is directing a search for a campus facility to remain open 24 hours a day. Reardon went on to say that, currently, the most likely candidate for such a place is the first floor of the Belk Center, including the Cavalier Grill and, possibly, the Mall.

Reardon explained that students who wish to study late might

find it easier to do so if they had a public place on campus where they could congregate in groups.

The current alternatives, according to Reardon, are Denny's

or Huddle House. However, the Black Mountain restaurants — far from being ideal study environments — are simply inaccessible to students without cars.

Exposing the entire Belk Center to theft or vandalism was not, Reardon admitted, a perfect solution. He suggested locking the fire doors leading to the second and third stories at midnight as per current operational procedures. Reardon did not discuss the administration's response to the proposal, nor did SGA President Justin Ramb offer comment on the subject when approached by *The Aletheia*.
