On Friday, April 16, the Cavs competed against Elon in a non-conference game. Elon out scored the Cavs seven to two. Even though the Cavs didn't pull through, there still were highlights of players' ability.

Chris Robertson, who pitched seven innings of the game, only walked three batters. Jamie Jessie and Arron McCall, then pitched the last two innings. Jay Johnson rocketed a pitch for a homerun. Chris Fulbright, Chris Hoyle, Jay Johnson, and Shawn Wills all had base hits. Hoyle, however, snagged a double with his hit.

When asked his opinion of the team, Chris Robertson, stated, "All we need to do is play more together and in the future we will be outstanding."

On Saturday, the Cavs played a double header against Bluefield College, splitting the victories in half.

In the first of the two games the final score was Bluefield six, Cavs two. Starter Jay

Allen pitched a strong game in defeat, with four strikeouts and only three walks. Jessee started pitching in the fourth inning and finished by striking out three and walking only one.

The players with base hits included: Chad Greene with two, Chris Glasgow with one, Chris Fulbright with a double and one RBI.

The Cavs lost the first game 6 - 2. Chad Greene stated, "We are all pretty young, inexperienced, and we're not swinging our bats to our ability. If we came to the ball parks swinging to our ability, we could beat anybody."

The batting picked up in the second game against Bluefield and the Cavs wrapped up a landslide win by playing to their ability and proving their talent.

The team played well, especially with Lance "Magoo" McCall hitting a home run. "The ball almost went over the scoreboard," said sophomore Traci Haynes.

Kirk Browman, head trainer for Bluefield stated, "The Cavaliers had good sportsmanship, nice facilities, and great leadership. They beat us up at our field earlier this season. It's obvious that Chaplain has worked with them."
