



til thoroughly coated. In small bowl combine soy sauce and sugar. Heat skillet or wok and add 3 tablespoons of the oil. When oil sizzles, stir-fry

chicken for 5 minutes. (Test a piece by piercing with a fork. Chicken is done when juices run clear.) Remove from pan. Add remaining oil to pan and stir-fry onions, ginger and garlic for one minute. Return chicken to pan

and continue cooking one minute. Add soy saucesugar mixture and cook quickly until sauce has thickened. Stir in wal-nuts. Spoon over rice and serve immediately. Crisply cooked snow peas make a perfect accompaniment.


