A quiet week passed with city fire reporting no calls.

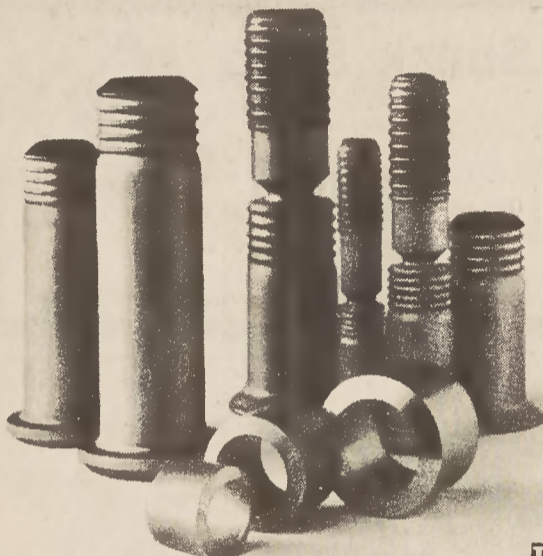
Police

LESS WEIGHT MEANS MORE MILEAGE

A subsidiary of Federal-Mogul Corporation has developed a patented line of new lightweight aerospace fasteners that will contribute to the fuel savings for the new generation of the world's commercial aircraft.

Huck Manufacturing Company, headquartered in Irvine, California, makes these fasteners out of titanium, a light, metallic element as strong as steel but half the weight. Huck uses this metal in combination with a patented design feature that makes their Lightweight Groove Proportioned Lockbolt fastener 25 percent lighter than other models in its class.

About \$360 in fuel costs are saved a year for each pound of weight reduction on a single aircraft. Since Huck fasteners provide the potential for the removal of about a thousand pounds from a single plane, that translates into a \$360,000 savings for each year of the craft's 15-year life span—\$5,400,000 for 15 years.

These fasteners will be used on a number of commercial airplanes, including the new fuel-efficient Boeing 767.

Huck Manufacturing, a major producer and mar-

keter of fastening systems primarily for the aerospace and railroad industry, was purchased by Federal-Mogul Corporation in August of 1980. The Huck acquisition further enhances the diversification of Federal-Mogul's products and markets and increased the company's aerospace business from three to six percent in 1980. That percentage of market share is estimated to rise to 14 percent in 1981.

Federal-Mogul, known principally as an automotive supplier for many years, is now a multinational manufacturer of precision parts for the transportation, farm equipment, construction and manufacturing industries as well as aerospace components, with 1980 sales of \$721 million. Headquartered in Southfield, Michigan, Federal-Mogul was founded in 1899 and today operates 40 plants, more than 50 distribution centers and five major research facilities.

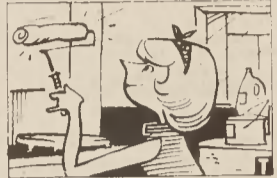

Yes, you can paint with a roller and keep the tray clean, too.

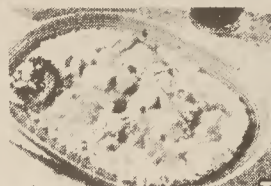

HOW TO BE A GOOD COOK

MASTER THE ART OF GRATING RIND



Lemon rind adds zip to chicken entrée.

Once mastered, cooking skills remain with you for a lifetime.

This simple idea for adding lemon rind to frozen prepared chicken in white wine sauce can be used again and again.

To grate the lemon, place the fine side of a grater over a piece of waxed paper. Using short, rapid, down-

ward strokes remove only the outer colored portion, or peel, of the fruit, not the bitter white pith under the skin.

EASY LEMON CHICKEN

2 pkgs. (8 1/4 oz. each) Swanson Frozen Prepared Chicken in White Wine Sauce Main Courses
1/4 tsp. grated lemon rind

Raise film cover from main courses; sprinkle each with 1/8 teaspoon lemon rind. Re-cover. Microwave on HIGH 5 to 6 minutes, stirring once. Microwave on HIGH 6 to 7 minutes or until hot. Let stand, covered 2 minutes. Stir before serving. Serve over cooked rice. Makes 2 servings.
