We are sure this double program of pictures weekly will prove of added joy and recreation for the men at the Base Hospital.

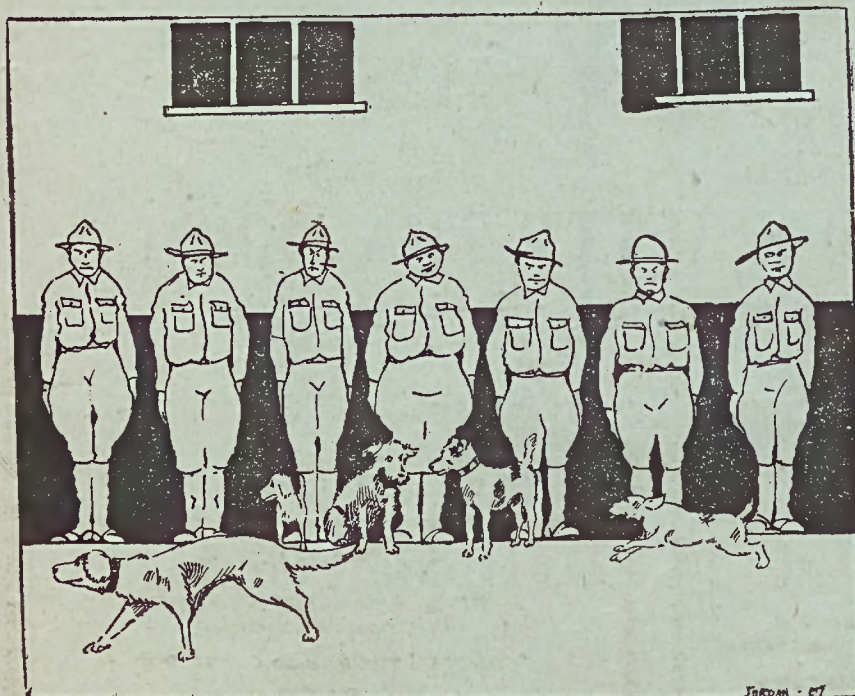
