Governor T. W. Bickett, of North Carolina, proclaims the day in the following public statement:-

That Sunday, October 6, be and it is hereby designated as Heroes' Day, on which day all of our people shall assemble in their churches, Sunday Schools, and meetings houses, in cities and towns, in villages, hamlets, and at cross roads, and shall pay tribute and homage to the boys who have laid down their lives in the sacred cause of Liberty. Let this day be made memorable and hallowed, and let the mem-ory and spirit of the neighborhood boy dead on the field of honor so move us that we shall withhold not of our substance in the cause for which he died. Let committees of patriotic men, women, and children sell these Liberty Bonds by the millions on that sacred occasion, while messages from stump and pulpit proclaim the purity of our motives and the justness of our cause.

LOOK UPON THE THINGS OF OTHERS.

A valued subscriber and a most liberal supporter of every cause, calls our attention to a rule of the Food Commission that restrict sthe supply of sugar to two pounds per person per month, but does not allow any more when you have guests in your home. These guests are entitled to their two pounds each, even when away from home and are using none, but it is only issued to them at home. If they fail to get their share, and use a part of the limited share of their host, he suffers.

In England it is said that it has become the custom for guests going to a home to take their sugar with them. Such a rule would prove a blessing here.
