NOW DISCHARGING

PERSONNEL OFFICE HAS CARRIED ON BIG WORK.

More than 20,000 men have been inducted into the service at Camp Greene by the Camp Personnel office and which organization is now engaged in discharging the men of the camp.

The personnel office was organized and its force built up by Major James E. Manierre, whose picture appears on the front cover of The Caduceus. Major Manierre has been in the service since May, 1917, when he was commissioned a lieutenant in the Signal Corps. His early training was in the aviation work at Kelly Field, Texas.

He reported at Camp Greene, July 12, 1918. Very shortly after he re-

ported at Camp Greene, N. C., it was decided by the War Department that this camp would not be used as an aviation camp, but would be used as a miscellaneous camp for the organization of overseas labor battalions and pioneer infantry, also as a receiving camp for limited service men.

Captain Manierre organized the Personnel Office at Camp Greene, building it from a force of two clerks and one officer to its present size of seven officers and one hundred and eighty-one enlisted men.

This organization has inducted into the service at this camp approximately twenty thousand colored men and five thousand white limited service men, organizing them into overseas Labor Battalions and Pioneer Infantry, classifying the men according to trades and occupations and transferring them on orders of the War Department to all branches of the service.

Captain Manierre was appointed Major, Adjutant General's Department, September 30th, 1918, and he and his organization are at the present time engaged in the discharge of the enlisted men and the officers at this camp preparatory to its discontinuance, having discharged and sent out to other states for discharge about 18000 men up to the present time.
