Jamestown Virtually County Champions

Jamestown High School soccer team trampled the Bison soccer team 4-0 yesterday afternoon. This is the second victory for the Jamestonians over High Point this year.

The defeat yesterday puts High Point out of the running for the county championship. This virtually concedes the championship to Jamestown.

The Jamestown hoofers scored twice during the first quarter and again they tallied two points when they ran wild in the fourth quarter. The Bison team was unable to hold back the Jamestown eleven as they smashed through for their victory. High Point lost its only chance for scoring when a penalty kick by High Point hit the top bar on the goal post.
