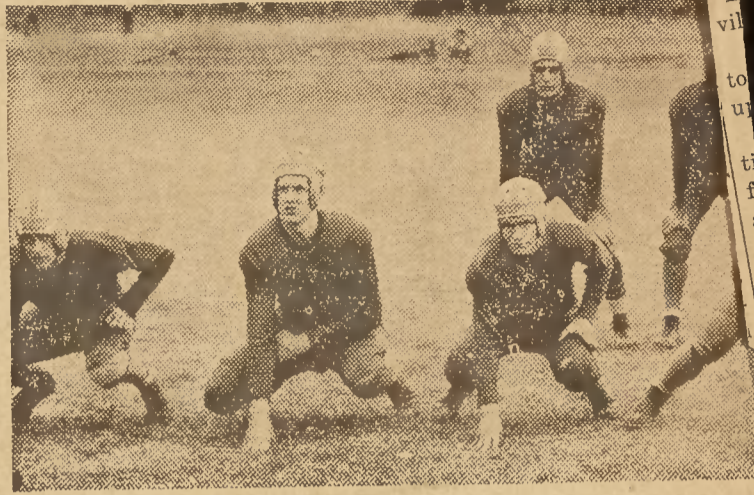

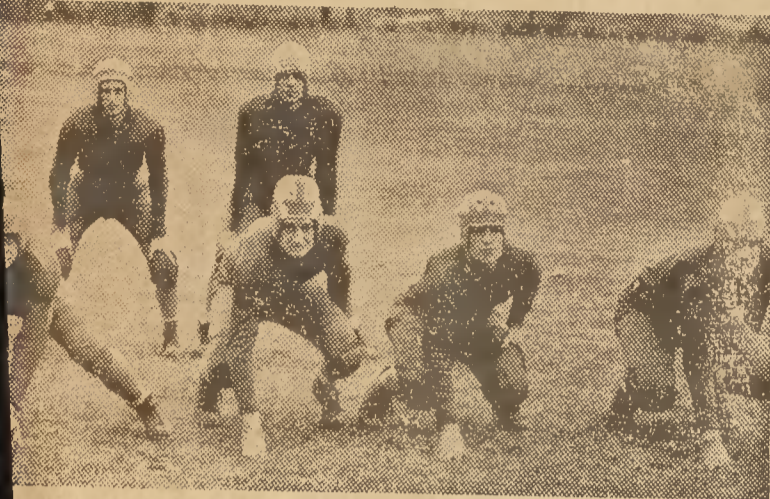

Game Tonight Decides Title In Conference

Bisons On Winning Spree; Are Underdogs in Game Tonight.

The Bison, riding the crest of a four game winning streak and climaxing a very successful season, battle the fighting whirlwind team from Greensboro tonight at the college stadium at 8 o'clock.

High Point's Black Bison, underdogs in this most important contest, will be fighting for their only chance at the state championship; if victorious, a coin must be tossed to decide whether High Point or Winston-Salem journey to Durham to play the Eastern Conference champions. In event that the team, which goes to Durham, is victorious, a game must be played with the team that was left at home to decide the state champions.

The ever-improving Bison, who have taken their last four games from Lexington, Salisbury, Charlotte and Gastonia, have been polishing up on those plays that took them to pay-dirt and they have been practicing blocking and tackling.

Hussey and his "Educated Toe" might be the deciding factor in the game, while Hucks, Short, and the Horney Brothers will take charge of the offensive work in the backfield. Boles, Wagner, Ferguson, and Kivett will be the biggest hindrance to the "Whirlwinds" offensive thrusts.

All the Bison players, except Bill Wagner, captain, who has a slight leg injury, but will probably see action from the starting whistle to the last second of play, are ready for action.
