Last year the Bison made a strong bid for conference honors—and were barely nosed out by the Purple Whirlwind from Greensboro. The Bison and the Whirlwind and the strong team from Winston-Salem are all striving, in a close race, to win the conference championship. Neither has been defeated, all three have been tied.

The Bison have to tangle with two more conference opponents, the Green Wave from Gastonia, and the Reynolds High team from Winston-Salem—considered one of the strongest teams of the south—by virtue of their 13-0 defeat of Charlotte. Charlotte defeated Greensboro 26-9 and High Point 7-6, and Winston-Salem defeated Charlotte—so the experts will pick the Winston-Salem footballers over the Whirlwind. High Point is given an even chance with the aggregation from the "tobacco" city, by virtue of their outplaying the Charlotte crew.

One thing that is in favor of the Bison is—beating Winston-Salem in their own back yard is considered improbable, and Greensboro encounters Winston in Winston-Salem, while the Bison tangle with the Deamon team on the Millis Stadium gridiron, where they have only lost two games in the past two years.

G'boro Leads Race; Bisons Close Second

The Western Conference race will reach its climax this and next week when the undefeated leaders will come to the top to meet the stronger teams of their own calibre.

High Point's Black Bison are now in second place sharing it respectively with Reynolds High of Winston-Salem. The reason for the Bison being in the runner up spot is not because they are behind but because they have not played as many conference games as the Purple Whirlwind of Greensboro. The Greensboro aggregation is credited with two and one half wins against one half loss that being to High Point when the Bison tied the favored team from the Gate City 0-0. Reynolds High is in the same position as High Point since they have won one, tied one, and lost none. This is a very close race and the championship hinges on who wins the Black Bison-Winston-Salem Game and the Reynolds High-Greensboro game. That is, of course, assuming that the Bison defeat the Green Wave of Gastonia which seems likely, since Greensboro defeated them so nandily.

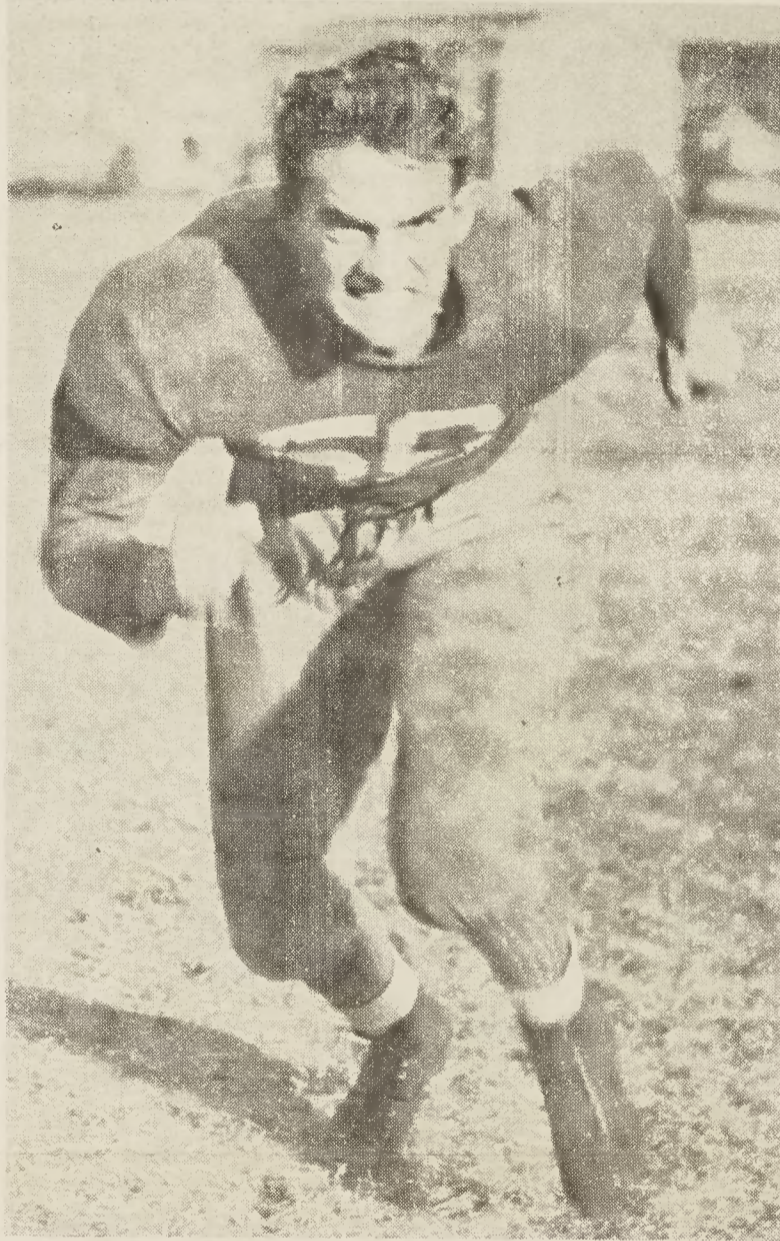
SOCCER PLAYERS FINISH SUCCESSFUL SCHEDULE

Powerful High Point Gridmen Meet Conference Rivals

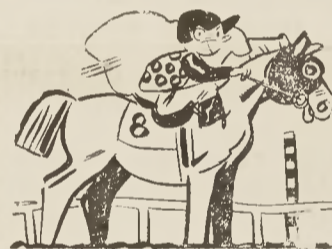
The Green Wave of Gastonia will pay host to the Black Bison tonight in the Cotton City as the two strong aggregations meet in a Western Conference clash.

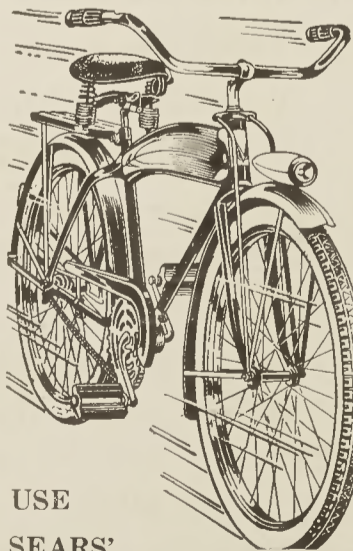
This contest is very important in the Western Conference since it will determine whether the Bison will be in for the payoff honors that will come next week when the season winds up.
