Mr. Henry is originally from Jacksonville, Florida. After finishing high school and spending one year as a student at the University of Florida in Gainesville, he went to Chicago to study music. There he was a student in theory and composition of Leo Sawexby, and in cello of Daniel Saidenberg. From September, 1930, to June, 1934, he was first cellist of the Chicago Symphony. During this time Mr. Henry was associated with the Chicago Civic Orchestra, conducted by Eric DeLamarter. He was first a member of the cello section, later as cello soloist and part-time conductor. 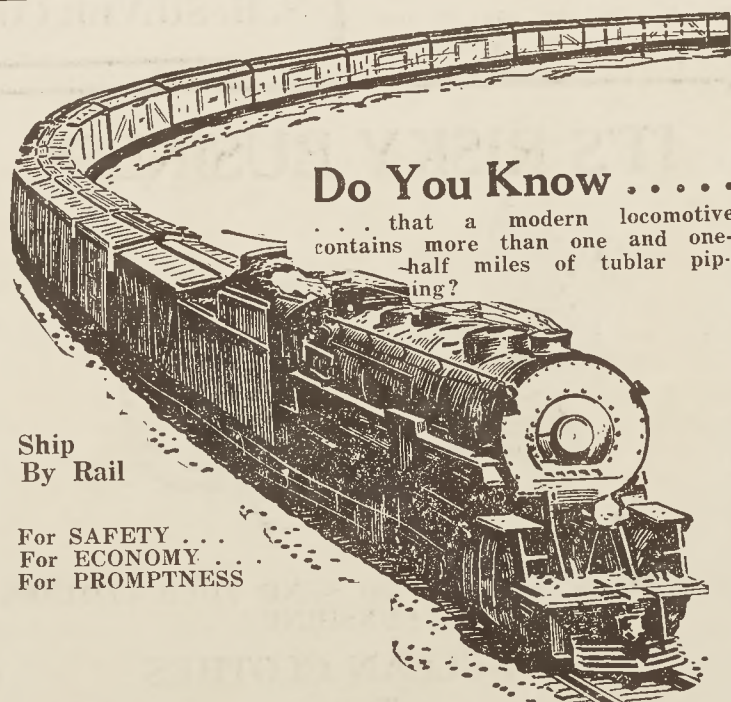


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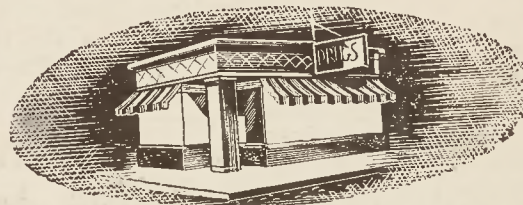
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
