

Mr. Tax-Payer Should Read This Statement

The following statement regarding certain tax payers taxes in certain townships should be of interest to every tax payer in Johnston County. Please read the heading of each column so you can see what the Democrats have done for you and what the Republicans have done. The taxes for 1926 were compiled by the former Republican administration and it will be seen that every person's tax listed below took a sudden jump upward in 1927 when the Democrats came back into power—in many instances more than doubled what they were in 1926 under Republican rule. The third column shows exactly the amount each tax payer's taxes increased under Democratic rule in 1927.
