Whatever else may be in store for the New Bern High school Bears tonight, when they entertain Washington's Pam-Pack here, there is little danger that they'll be plagued by cockiness.

Any illusions the Bruins might have had about their own invincibility vanished last Friday when the Morehead City Eagles defeated them 6-0 in the rain. It was no fluke win. That night the Bruins were outplayed and outsmarted, statistic notwithstanding. Fumbles hurt, but the better ball club on the field emerged as victor.
