Through the years due to the efforts of groups such as the New Deal's CCC (Civilian Conservation Corps), forestry experts, researchers, and conscientious wood companies, such as Weyerhaeuser, the South's forest land has been turned into productive farms of timber. After the film, Mr. Kirk answered informal questions the Rotarians had about types of trees to plant and the tree farms of the Weyerhaeuser Company.
