## Harris advances

**WILSON** - Rufus Harris, single-handedly led West Craven to a tenth place finish in the NCHSAA East Regional Track Meet here last Thursday. Harris blazed to a 14.2 seconds clocking in the 110 meter high hurdles enroute to a first place finish and a new school record. In fact, he shattered the record by six tenths of a second. Head Track Coach Clay Jordan explained that Harris' time is the best in the state by a high school runner this year. Harris also

placed fifth in the 180 meter low hurdles.

Harris will advance to the NCHSAA State Track Meet at the N. C. State Track in Raleigh on Friday in the high hurdles. The last West Craven High School athlete to advance to the State Meet was Ernest Butler in 1979. Butler won the shot put.
