Nineteen Students Are Named On Third Quarter Honor Roll

Honorable Mention Lists Thirty-two Girls; Fulton Makes Highest Average for Quarter

Nineteen girls made the honor roll for the third quarter of the 1944-45 session and thirty-two were named to the honorable mention list.

Seven seniors were on the academic college honor roll; one sophomore, two freshmen, and five sophomores were named on the high school honor roll. The eight students on the high school honor roll were: Shirley Frew with an average of 91 1/2 on 4 subjects; Sarah Bain, a sophomore, with an average of 91 on 4 subjects; Molly Hazen, a freshman averaging 91 on 4 subjects; Roberta Huffman, a sophomore averaging 91 on 4 subjects; Hettie Murphy, a freshman with an average of 90 1/4 on 4 subjects; Marietta Duke, a sophomore with an average of 89 4/5 on 5 subjects; Louise Eichhorn, a sophomore averaging 89 1/5 on 5 subjects; and Mary Beverly Wilson, a sophomore averaging 87 3/4 on 4 subjects.

Four business students were named on the honor roll. They were Katherine Taylor with an average of 95 on 4 subjects, Lenora Heptinstall with an average of 91 1/2 on 4 subjects, Ann Feagan, averaging 90 on 4 subjects, and Sarah Ingle, averaging 88 1/4 on 4 subjects.
