Constitution Committee Makes Many SMS May Day Festivities End With Major Changes In SMS Constitution Elaborate Dreamer's Holiday Dance

Group Alters Names and Duties Student Body Will Vote May 12

The Constitution Committee reported several changes in the Constitation on which the Student Body will vote May 12, 1950.

The first major change is the changing of the name of the vicechairman of the Hall Council to the assistant secretary of the Hall Council because she has been performing the duties of assistant secretary.

Another major change is the addition of another duty to the President of the Student Government Association, which will be to assume the duties of the chairman of the Hall Council during the temporary absence of the chairman or to appoint a member of the Hall Council to serve as acting chairman.

The following duties were recommended for the Day Student counselors: (1) To attend Hall Council meetings when there is a case involving a day student or when day student matters are to be discussed, (2) To enforce Hall Council regulations as they apply to Day Students, (3) To exercise leadership among the day students by helping them in problems and activities of school life and to assist the Dean of Students in such matters.

A fourth major change is the statement that all Hall Counselors and vice-counselors are seniors or students who have passed junior work.
