The nominating Committee meets two days before each election, and nominations are heard from the floor the day before each election. Cards must be submitted to the Chairman of the Nominating Committee for nominations from the floor. Revoting, if necessary, will be held on the same day of the election unless it is a Friday election, in which case revoting will be the following Monday.
