Mardy was president of the freshman class, a representative of the student government, secretary of the Latin Club, a varsity cheerleader, and a member of the May Court at Whiteville High School. At St. Mary's, Mardy has been a dance marshal, a member of the Young Republicans Club, a Sigma cheerleader, and will be on the May Court for the second year this spring.
