## Raleigh Colleges Present Concert At Memorial Auditorium

A Raleigh "first" will occur April 24 when 400 students from the Raleigh-based colleges and universities (members of Cooperating Raleigh Colleges) will perform a program of sacred and classical music in Memorial Auditorium at 8 p.m.

The 325-voice choir will consist of the Meredith College Chorus (Jane W. Sullivan, director), the N.C. State Varsity Men's Glee Club (Milton Bliss, director), and University Choir (James Dellinger, director), the Peace College Choir (Raymond Kreiner, director), the St. Augustine's College Choir (Addison Reed, director), and the St. Mary's College Glee Club (Geraldine Cate, director). An orchestral accompaniment will be the 75-piece North Carolina State University Orchestra, conducted by James Dellinger.

Concert conductor will be Gerhard P. Schroth, director of music for the public schools of Racine, Wisconsin. Schroth has been concertmaster of the Milwaukee Symphony and is the founder of the Lutheran Choir of Milwaukee. For four seasons he conducted the St. Louis Philharmonic Orchestra and Civic Chorus, later moving to Chicago to become director of music at Rockefeller Chapel on the University of Chicago campus.

His professional life has exhibited an interest in young people; he has conducted youth concerts, music camps, state festivals, and summer schools in at least fifteen states and in Canada.

The Friday night program will consist of "Psalm 100" by Schuetz-Lynn; "Te Deum Laudamus" by Haydn; "Song of Human Rights" by Hanson; and "A Stronghold Sure," Cantata No. 80, by Bach.

The public is cordially invited to attend the concert; and there will be no charge for admission.

She was a member of the National Honor Society, a nominee for Outstanding Teenager of America, Junior Class President, head varsity cheerleader, Miss Hopewell High, "Best All Round", and "Most School Spirited." Here at St. Mary's, Linda is

always on the Honor Roll, a member of the YWCA, and a worker in the dining hall.

As Secretary of the Social Board, Linda will serve as a member of the Social Board and as Chairman of the Appeals Court. Her other duties are to give students written notification of Hall Council penalties, to make a written report of Social Board penalties after each meeting and to submit it to the Dean of Students, to prepare in duplicate an annual report of the work of the Social Board at the end of the academic year and to submit one copy to the President of the college and to file the other copy with Student Government records and to perform general secretarial duties of the Social Board and Hall Council.

When asked about her newly elected position, Linda said, "I want to serve ravioli three times a day." ## Indian Actress Lectures On Eastern Poetry

On April 14, Madher Jaffrey gave a program entitled "A Thousand and One Nights" of Eastern poetry and prose. Educated at Delhi University in New Delhi, India, Miss Jaffrey won a scholarship to the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art in London. After graduation she came to the United States to teach pantomime. From appearing in several BBC television plays, Miss Jaffrey's dramatic career advanced to a part in the off-Broadway "King of the Dark Chamber." She has appeared in many major television shows and a special "Camera Three" program on India. In 1965, Miss Jaffrey was voted Best Actress of the Year at the Berlin Film Festival for her role in "Shakespeare Wallach."

Her narration included excerpts from material dating to before Christ. Literature from India, Japan, China, and Lebanon was also included, touching such universal experiences in human life as love, marriage, and death.
