Creative Arts Festival To Be Held At Christ Church

At one of the original planning meetings for Christ Church's Creative Arts Festival, Mary Silver, a junior at St. Mary's Junior College, created the poem above. Mary's poem reinforces the theory that people possess a sometimes latent, but always present, personal creativity.

To further reinforce this theory, the Senior Episcopal Young Churchmen of Christ Church are sponsoring a Creative Arts Festival for all Raleigh-area high school students in an attempt to involve local students in an experience of creative self-expression. The festival will encompass the weekend of February 5th.

The festival will begin Friday at 4:00 at Christ Church and will initially center around a coffeehouse. Workshops in the fields of music, drawing and painting, sculpture, drama, photography, film and creative writing will be located at different parts of the church. Professionals in each field will be on hand for consultation and evaluation. The Mind Garage will provide music during the weekend.

The workshops will continue through Saturday night. The culmination of the weekend will be a worship service on Sunday, put together by the students using their productions from the festival. The worship and celebration service will be followed by a concert Sunday afternoon.

It is the hope of the sponsors that the Creative Arts Festival will provide the youth of Raleigh with an experience in sharing and communicating ideas freely. Through creative media they feel that this is possible.

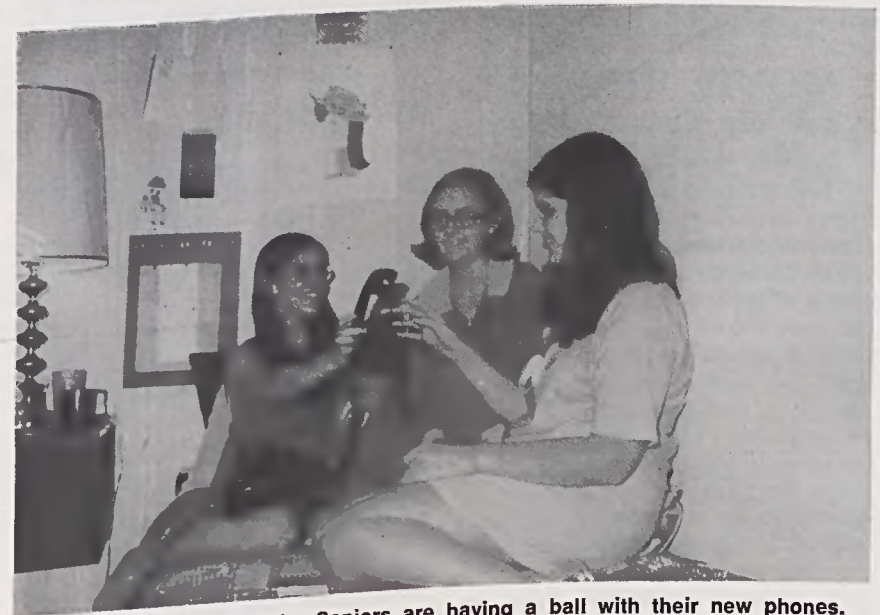

and doubles tennis matches. So far, the total points gained in Sigma-Mu competition are 65 points, Mus and 35 points, Sigmas.

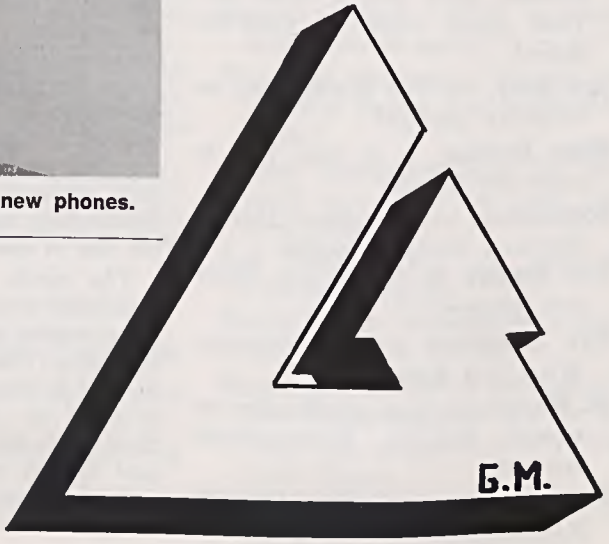
