

Rules Of St. Mary's School

(Reprint from BULLETIN of 1860)

1. At the calling of the roll, morning and evening, every student must be present, unless prevented by sickness.
2. Every pupil must attend morning and evening prayers, and the daily services in the Chapel. If prevented by sickness, or any other cause, she must inform the lady who has charge of her dormitory.
3. Pupils are required to be punctual at their meals, and must not leave the table without permission.
4. The practicing hours must be devoted exclusively to that duty; pupils must carefully avoid intruding upon one another in these hours.
5. No works of Fiction are to be read, excepting on Saturday, after the duties of the day are over, and then, only those that are approved of.
6. On Saturday evening every pupil must be present at the musical exercises, unless she has special permission to absent herself.
7. At least two hours a day must be appropriated by every pupil, to active exercise in the open air. Five times round the grove, twice a day, will be deemed a fulfilment of this requisition.

SCHOOL ROOM

8. During the study hours, pupils are required to preserve perfect order. Talking, moving of seats, writing letters, and reading books not connected with their studies, are expressly forbidden.
9. The same order is to be observed during the other hours devoted to the duties of the School, not only in the School room, but wherever the pupil is permitted to pursue her studies.

VISITING, DRESS, &c.

10. Pupils are allowed to visit only on the monthly Saturday, and then, only at the house to which they have been specially invited; they are required to be at home by sundown.

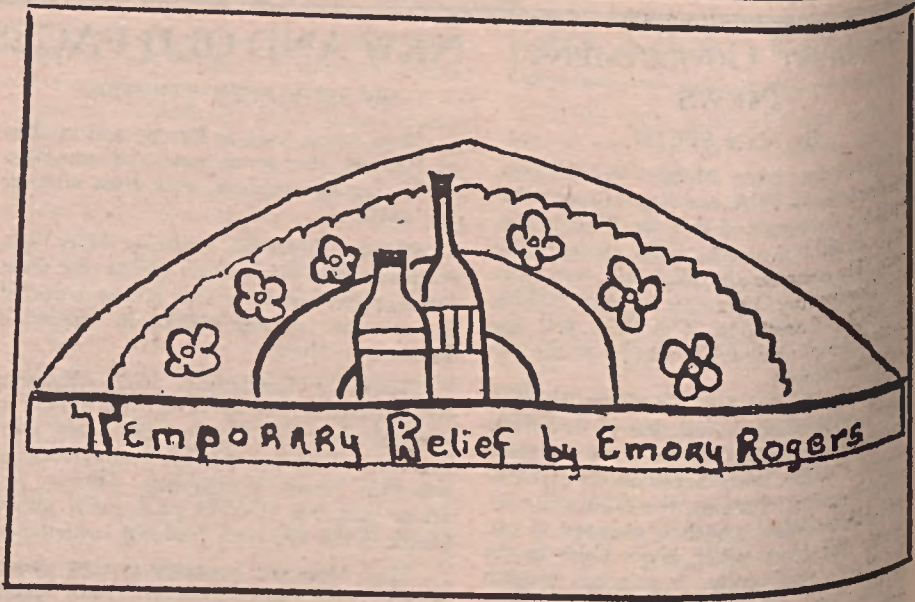
ALTAR GUILD BEGINS 1972-'73 YEAR
