A good way to begin your research is by taking the Aptitude Test. This is offered in the Guidance Office to anyone who is interested in finding out about certain career possibilities. The test asks you a number of questions about what you are most interested in as a possible career. After taking the test, your guidance counselor will discuss your test results and help you decide which field best suits you. Your guidance counselor is more than happy to help you and will offer you some helpful suggestions concerning your career.

There are a number of catalogs in the guidance office that can also help you with your career research. For instance, "The Art of Developing a Career" discusses what your interests may be and gives a list of different jobs to which your interests might take you. Another helpful catalog is "Self-Assessment and Career Development," which offers a number of job listings and what they can do for you, along with a selection of career goals and desired promotions. "Career Employment Opportunities Director (Volume 1)" gives a list of Corporations and Industries that offer you a number of job opportunities, from secretarial work to Industrial Engineering. These catalogs, along with other helpful reference materials, are also available and are free for every student to come by and read. These materials should help you with your career decisions.

There are a wide variety of job opportunities that are offered for women today. The Guidance Office is always willing to help anyone who has questions concerning career choices.
