registered medical technologists ranged from \$8,500 to \$9,500. Experienced medical technologists in various positions earn between \$12,000 and \$14,000.

"Recent studies indicate that medical technologists with the bachelor's degree from a program such as Belmont Abbey's are in increasing demand for the more responsible administrative positions," Dr. Stuart commented.

Training for medical technology at Belmont Abbey College is at the baccalaureate level. The first three years of study follow the normal curriculum for either the biology or chemistry concentrations. A full year of laboratory work follows at either Mercy Hospital in Charlotte, N.C., or at St. Joseph's Hospital in Asheville, N.C. The program is fully accredited and approved by the American Society of Clinical Pathologists and the American Medical Association.

Belmont Abbey College has a well-developed financial aid program, including scholarships, grants-in-aid, student loans, and work-study, and assistance is available to any student who shows a need.
