## New President Appointed

In the more than 100 years of its existence, Belmont Abbey has had only 7 presidents; Fr. Neil W. Tobin will be the eighth.

At a press conference on March 16, Abbot Jude Cleary, O.S.B., announced that Fr. Tobin will succeed Father John Bradley as president of Belmont Abbey College.

Father Tobin, a native of Cascade, Iowa, received the B.A. degree in Latin from Loras College in Dubuque, Iowa, and the M.A. and Ph.D. degrees in classical languages and literatures from Fordham University. He received the S.T.B. and S.T.L. degrees in theology from Gregorian University in Rome.

For the past seventeen years, Fr. Tobin has been associated with Loras College in various capacities. He most recently served as vice president for academic affairs. Since 1972 he has been national secretarytreasurer of Delta Epsilon Sigma, a national honors society, and will continue to hold this office here at Belmont Abbey College. Fr. Tobin has always been interested in the arts and was a member of the Board of Directors and second vice president of the Dubuque Symphony Orchestra. At present he is the Pastor of St. Donatus Church in St. Donatus,

Fr. Tobin was among 18 candidates considered by an eight-member committee seeking a president since Fr. Bradley's November announcement that he will resign in May to concentrate on Belmont Abbey's "external affairs."

At the conference, Fr. Tobin said he hopes to bring together "a community of planners" to develop long range plans for the Abbey.

He plans to study how the


College can meet the academic needs of the religious and

business community around Belmont Abbey College. And he wants to keep lines of communication open among teachers, students, alumni and trustees.

"I'm really a co-worker with God trying to realize our Father's plan for an institution," Father Tobin said. "Many times our Father's plan is different from ours, and it becomes a matter of discerning what God's plan is and having the courage to go along with it."

Asked if the search committee conducted an extensive search for a president before deciding on Fr. Tobin, Abbot Jude replied: "The fact that we got a man from Iowa may indicate to you it widespread."

Father Tobin said it's his 'prayer, hope and expectation' that he'll be able to walk in the footsteps of the College's past presidents, which included Abbot Jude and Fr. Bradley.
