### N.C. Governor's Conference

## Two From Abbey Selected

Two persons from Belmont Abbey College were chosen as official delegates to the North Carolina Governor's Conference of Library and Information Services.

Mrs. Jane Freeman, director of learning resources of the Abbot Vincent Taylor Library, and Mrs. Jean Moore, assistant professor of English and an alumna of the College ('63), were among 200 persons officially chosen by the delegate selection committee from over 1,200 nominees.

The overall objective of the

October 19-21 conference held at the Raleigh, N.C. Civic Center was to develop recommendations from the citizens of North Carolina for increasing the effectiveness of library and information services at both the state and national levels.

At the end of the two and a half day conference, the delegates elected twelve official delegates to the White House Conference and voted on recommendations to be presented at the Washington Conference in 1979.
