For most of you, who are from out of town, here is a list of places to eat within walking distance of the NCSSM campus. Since your parents probably will not give you more than a certain amount of money each month, dollar signs are included to help you price your meals.

- **Bahn's:** A little restaurant on Ninth Street, that serves mostly Vietnamese food, with other Asian dishes. \$\$
- **Ben and Jerry's:** Ice Cream, Brownies, etc. Located beside Wellspring Grocery on Broad Street. \$\$

- **Bully's:** Mainly All-American, with their famous

"Bully's Cheese Steak," located about half a block from Science and Math, on Broad Street. \$

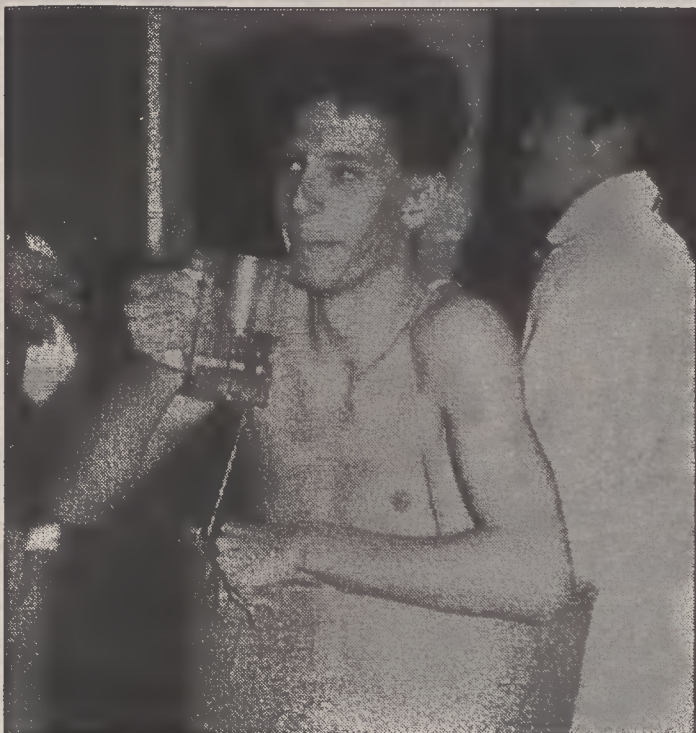
