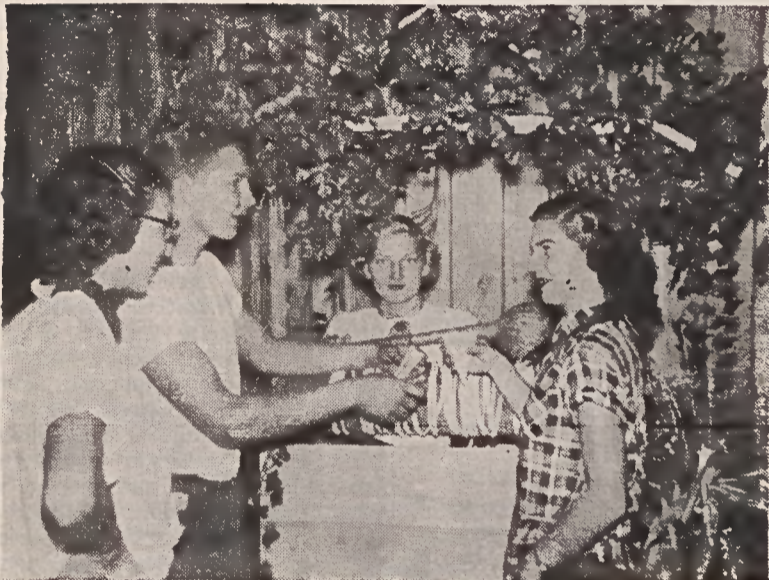

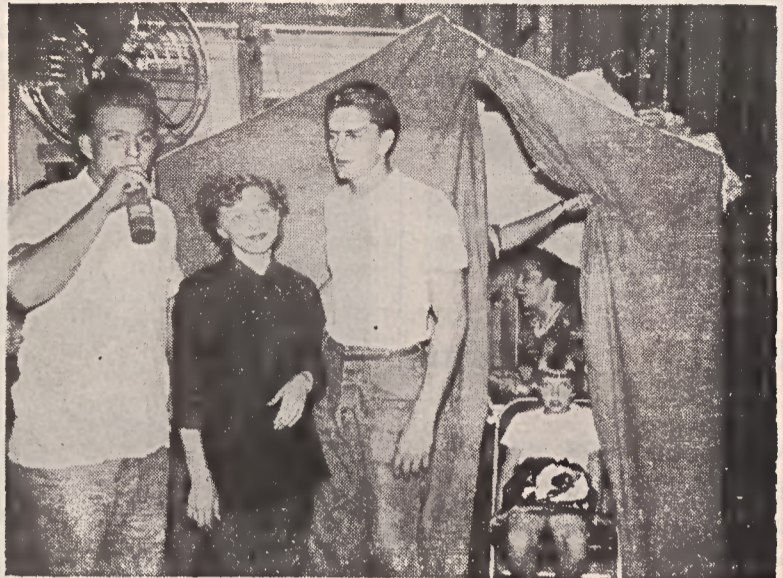
Visits Cheerleaders Dance
