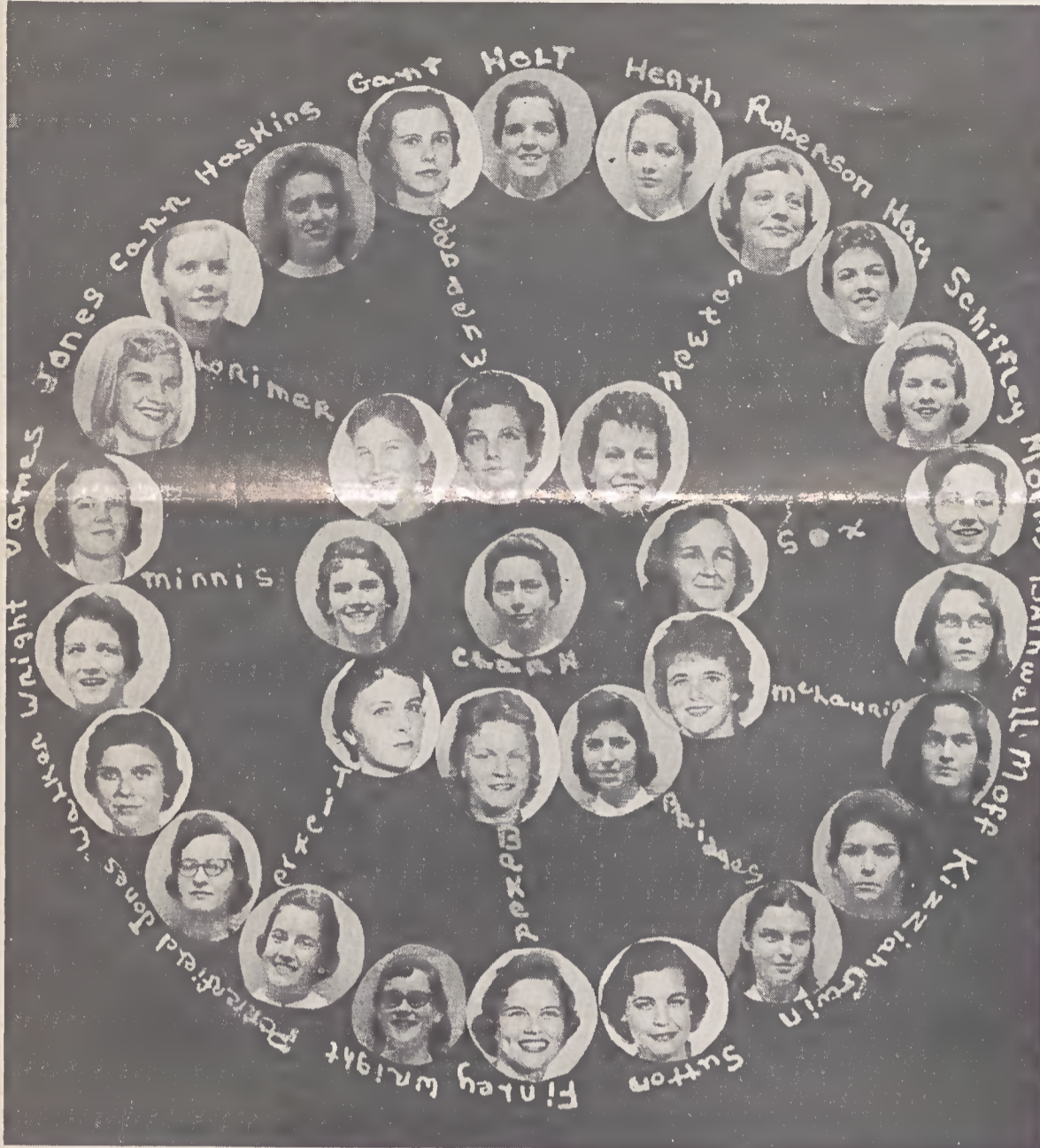


The Homecoming Wheel Of Fortune . .
