Friday night, October 18, Williams High School's Bulldogs play host to the Raleigh Caps in the Bulldogs' annual homecoming game at Memorial Stadium.




Sandra Sox was chosen by the D. O. Club to represent them during the homecoming festivities. Sandra will be escorted by Don Wright.
