PLANT UNITED FUND DRIVE

"Thanks to you, it's working" is the theme of the 1972-73 United Fund campaign lasting from October 9th to the 19th. This years' goal is \$21,500.

Plant employees contributed a total of \$20,744 (separate from the \$4,000 corporate gift) last year. The increase in our goal this year reflects in part a 9.4% increase in the budgets of Transylvania and Henderson counties.

Transylvania, Henderson, and Buncombe county agencies are included in this years' distribution in proportion to Plant population living in these counties.

Solicitors from all areas will give every plant employee an opportunity during the Plant campaign to review the needs of the many worthy community agencies included in the budgets and make their contribution to help fulfill these needs.
