These desserts are especially good in summer because they are cool and light. "Apricot Delight" was given to me by Reva Allman. The "Oreo Cake" receipe is provided by Jane Fleming. The "Sour Cream Banana Pudding" is one of my own.

Apricot Delight

2/3 cup of sugar 2/3 cup of water 6 oz. apricot Jello 1 jar jr. apricot baby food 8 oz. can crushed pineapple 11/2 cups pecans 8 oz. package cream cheese 1 can Eagle Brand milk

Bring to a boil 2/3 cup sugar, 2/3 cup water and 6 oz. apricot Jello. Add 1 jar junior apricot baby food. Stir well. Add 8 oz. can crushed pineapple with juice. Let cool. Add 11/2 cup pecans. Mix 8 oz. package cream cheese and 1 can Eagle Brand milk. Add to first mixture. (Cream cheese should be soft.) Put into 9" x 13" dish and refrigerate all day or over night. This molds well also.

P.S. Use 1 large box of Jello (6 oz.) or 2 small (3 oz.) boxes.

Oreo Cake

16 oz. bag Oreo cookies - crushed 1 stick margine — melted 8 oz. cream cheese - softened

12 oz. Cool Whip 1 large instant chocolate pudding 2 ²/₃ cup milk

1 cup powdered sugar

- Mix pudding with milk and refrigerate. Crush cookies in blender or food processor. Melt margarine. Mix cookie crumbs with margarine and press in bottom of 13" x 9" x 2" pan.
- In large bowl mix cream cheese and powdered sugar, fold in $\frac{1}{2}$ of the Cool Whip then put on top of cookie crumbs in pan. Refrigerate for 30 min. Spread pudding on top of cream cheese mixture then spread rest of Cool Whip
- on top of pudding Save some cookie crumbs to sprinkle on top of Cool Whip.
- Refrigerate.

Sour Cream **Banana Pudding**

2 small boxes of vanilla instant pudding mix 3 cups of milk 1/2 cup sugar

8 oz. carton of sour cream 1 small container of Cool Whip

- 6-8 bananas
 - 1 box of vanilla wafers

Blend these ingredients in the order they are listed. Make a layer of vanilla wafers and then sliced bananas. Spread about half of the pudding mixture over wafers and bananas. Make another layer of wafers and bananas and finish with remaining pudding mixture. Use a large container as this is a big pudding.
