

13 Elect VTI

An announcement was made last February concerning a VTI (Voluntary Termination Incentive) opportunity becoming available to our wageroll personnel. A window of sign-up time was opened from February 15, 1988 until March 15, 1988 and applicants had to be off roll by April 15, 1988.

The VTI was offered as one step in improving our competitive situation. Participants in the program received one week's pay for each year of service in addi-

Thirteen of our co-workers elected to accept the company's offer. For some, a new
