H. S. outfit during the coming season at a meeting of the letter men of the squad, which was held January 18 in the school cafeteria.

Only four men will be absent from next year's squad, Captain Ned Lipscomb, Willard Watson, "Dizzy" Hargrove, and "Chuck" Burgess having been the only men to bid farewell to high school mole skins at the end of the past season. With a wealth of material on hand, next season should find Greensboro High School represented by a strong outfit and one that should be a strong bid for next years' state championship.

Although he was not connected with the high school faculty during the past season he spent a good deal of his time helping Coaches Coletrane and Routh and it was partly through his aid that the "Purple and Gold" put such a strong squad on the field during the past season.
