

# Purple Whirlwinds Defeat Reidsville in Close Game

## BURROUGHS STAR

Game Was Pitched Battle From Beginning to End — Both Elevens Played Well.

## WICKER SCORES SAFETY

Dickerson Outstanding Man of Reidsville Eleven—See Makes Touchdown for Greensboro.

Coach Lester Belding's Purple Whirlwinds defeated a hard-fighting eleven from Reidsville high by the score of 9-6 in Memorial Stadium, Friday night, October 2. Captain Jack Burroughs, of the Whirlwinds, was again the outstanding star of the game, giving chase to Terrill, who received a pass with an open field before him, and downed him before he reached the goal line with the winning score in the last few minutes of play. Lee, for Greensboro, and Dickerson, of Reidsville, also played a good game.

## The Game Play by Play

First quarter: Reidsville opened the game with Truitt kicking off to Burroughs, who was grounded by Rankin. Whitt failed to gain around left end, and then tries right end, but is stopped by Baisley, and then fails to gain on a center plunge. Burroughs punts out of bounds on Reidsville's 43-yard line. Truitt takes the ball for Reidsville and fumbles, recovering before being stopped by Phillips, and then fails to gain around right end. Dickerson punts to Rees, who takes the ball to our 45-yard line. Pittman goes through right tackle before being stopped by Truitt, and then is stopped by Turner with a yard gain around left end. Whitt goes back and Norcum takes the ball on a trick play, but fumbles and recovers with a loss. Whitt plunges through tackle for a five-yard gain, and then tries a pass, but is tackled for a five-yard loss with the ball still in his hands. Burroughs punts over the goal line.

Reidsville takes the ball on their 20-yard line. Truitt goes through center for eight yards. Richardson hits tackle for five yards before he is nailed by Lipscomb. Richardson fumbles, losing five yards and then punts out of bounds on Greensboro's 23-yard line.

Pittman goes through tackle for five yards, and then skirts right end for five more. Whitt goes around right end on a fake play for ten yards before he is tackled by Truitt. Norcum gains three yards, and then Pittman nets five yards on a fake play, being stopped by Rankin. Norcum hits center for three yards, and Whitt tries a fake around right end without a gain. Whitt makes eight yards around left end, and is stopped by Richardson. Greensboro is penalized 15 yards for roughness. Burroughs punts to Dunn on the 17-yard line. Taylor punts out of bounds on his own 42-yard line. Pittman makes two yards through center, and then gains three yards on a fake. Rees carries the ball five yards and is stopped by Taylor, Dickerson, and Rankin.

## Both Teams Score Touchdowns

Second quarter: Whitt recovers a fumble for a ten-yard loss and then goes around left end for five yards, and fails to gain around right end. Burroughs punts to Richardson, who is stopped by Rees on his 17-yard line. Richardson tries a pass, but it is incomplete. Richardson punts to Rees, who returns it to Reidsville's 30-yard line.

Whitt gains two yards around right end, and then fails at left end. Burroughs goes down the field to Reidsville's 15-yard line. Lee goes around left end 15 yards for a touchdown. Wrenn dropped-kicked the extra point.

Burroughs kicks off to Dickerson, but is stopped by Wicker. Terrill makes five yards around left end. Dickerson's pass to Richardson is too long and is grounded. Dickerson adds five yards and Truitt punts through center for three more. Dickerson passes to Richardson, who goes to Greensboro's two-yard line. Dickerson plunges over for a touchdown, and then fails to make the extra point.

Dickerson kicked off to Greensboro. Lee carried the ball around left end, but was stopped by Dickerson and Terrill after a 10-yard run. Lee makes three yards at center, skirts right end for five more, adds a few on a fake play and then is stopped by Rankin at left end. Burroughs made 15 yards around right end before he was stopped by Truitt. Lee stepped around right end for two yards and passed to Burroughs, who was stopped on Reidsville's 7-yard line on the next play. Greensboro tried two line plunges without a gain, and then Burroughs carried the ball over, but the play was called back on a penalty. Rees carried the ball to Reidsville's one-yard line as the horn blew for the half.

Third quarter: Burroughs kicked off to Dunn who was stopped on Reidsville's 30-yard line. Reidsville tried a pass but it was intercepted by Hester and carried to Reidsville's 22-yard line.

Lee failed to gain at right end and then Burroughs goes around right end to Reidsville's 10-yard line. Lee tried left end without a gain, and then Burroughs failed to gain at right end. Lee's pass to Burroughs was grounded over the goal line.

Reidsville's ball on her own 30-yard line. Dickerson tried a fake play but was stopped in his tracks. Dickerson galloped around right end for ten yards, before he was nailed by Lee. Dickerson hit center three times in succession for

Burroughs fails to gain at right end. Greensboro is penalized 15 yards when the backfield is in motion before the ball is snapped. Burroughs carried the ball back to Reidsville's 3-yard line. Pittman failed to gain at center and Norcum's fumble was recovered by Reidsville.

Wicker Adds Two Points. Dickerson fell back to punt, but Wicker broke through and nailed him behind the line for a safety, the score 9-6 in favor of Greensboro.

# BELDING'S TEAM MEETS SALISBURY AT GREENSBORO

Rowan County Boys Have Strong Line and Backfield.

## WHIRLWINDS ARE READY

Phillips, Dempsey, and Thornburn, Injured Men, Return for Play in Good Condition.

The Purple Whirlwinds will meet the Salisbury eleven at Memorial Stadium this afternoon at 3:30 in a crucial battle for the Western Conference championship.

The Salisbury team has always been a dangerous rival to Greensboro and this year the squad is considered to be extra strong. The Greensboro eleven is ready for the visiting squad and it is sure to be a real battle.

This year the Salisbury team is greatly strengthened having five lettermen returning in the backfield and five of the regular linemen returning. Last year Salisbury tied with Winston-Salem for second place in the conference standing of Class A. This year in the first two games Salisbury has come out with the big end of the scores winning from Mocksville eleven 55-0. The Raleigh eleven went down to Salisbury by the score of 10-0. Last Friday the Gastonia eleven tied Salisbury at 7-7 and Gastonia beat Asheville earlier in the season.

The loss of Captain Saleeby in the line and Barnhardt in the backfield will not hurt Salisbury a great deal as there are lettermen to replace them. The total number of lettermen returning to the squad this year exceeds that of any team in the Western conference.

Salisbury comes here with a clean slate having won two games and tied one. Greensboro has won two and lost one winning the first two games of the season against Sanford and Reidsville, and losing to Charlotte in their third start last Friday. Last year Greensboro tied Salisbury 4-4.

Coach Belding has announced his team as ready for the invaders and he is putting the squad through daily workouts and scrimmages. Harry Phillips, injured in the Reidsville game, and not able to get in the Charlotte game, will probably be ready for Salisbury. Arnold Dempsey, who suffered a badly wrenched foot in scrimmage just before the Reidsville game, will probably return to the lineup in time for Friday's game; and Ned Thornburn, injured at the same time Dempsey was, will probably be ready also. All three of the above are linemen. Ock Hester, hefty center, looks like a possible successor of Lipscomb at the center position.

# HARRIERS LOSE THEIR OPENING CONTEST

Gulfport Frosh Take Big End of 28-7 Score; Koury Best Runner for Local Cross Country Team.

Coach A. Paul Routh's cross country harriers lost their first decision of the year to the Gulfport Frosh at Gulfport by the score of 28-7, over a two-mile course.

# Charlotte Defeats Winds; First Out of Town Game

Charlotte defeated Greensboro high 18 to 0 after a hard slippery game played in mud at the high school field in Charlotte last Friday.

Gadd and Burroughs starred with Gadd making two touchdowns and more yardage than any man on the field for Charlotte and Burroughs played a wonderful defensive game, did the punting, and shared with the backs in ground gained for Greensboro. Isehour, left end, and Cathey, left tackle, were the outstanding linemen on Charlotte's team and Riley and Wrenn for the Winds.

The rain and mud thwarted Belding's air attack, weakening the Winds on the offensive. Our team played as good a game as Charlotte in spite of the fact that Charlotte won.

First quarter: Morris kicks off to Whitt who takes it to our 47-yard line. Whitt fumbles losing 15 yards and Morris recovers a punt from Burroughs.

Gadd gets the ball, but slips in the mud for a loss and taking the ball again he goes around right end for 15 yards before being stopped by Whitt. Pemberton rushes in and tackles Gadd for a 5-yard loss. Gadd plunges through center for 2 yards.

Charlotte penalized 5 yards for off-sides. Gadd punts over 20-yard line. Whitt skirts right end for 5 yards and then rushes tackle for 5 yards. Burroughs punts to Morris who fumbles and the ball is recovered by Greensboro. Whitt loses on right end, is made by Pittman. Burroughs kicks off to Morris who returns the ball to our 35-yard line.

Gadd makes 10 yards at right tackle and 5 yards at center. Morris fails to gain on right end. Gadd nets 10 yards on left end before being stopped by Burroughs. Time out for Greensboro.

Gadd skirts right end for 10 yards. Haines recovers his own fumble, but is tackled for a loss by Whitt. Gadd fails to gain on left end so he tries it again, racing down the field 25 yards untouched for a touchdown. Gadd plunges for the extra point but fails to get it across.

Morris kicks off to Rees. Whitt fails to gain on right end, but Burroughs nets 5 yards on the same end. Burroughs punts to Morris on his 25-yard line. Morris races down the field evading all players and has an open field ahead when Burroughs overtakes him and brings him down on our 17-yard line. Morris pounds his way to our 6-yard line. Gadd goes over, but Charlotte is penalized 15 yards for holding. Gadd hits left end for 2 yards and Morris goes around right end for a touchdown. He tries a place kick for the extra point, but fails.

Second quarter: Morris kicks off to Whitt, but the play goes over. Morris kicks off to Rees who carries the ball to our 40-yard line. Greensboro is penalized 5 yards. Pittman fumbles. Gadd recovers the ball and carries it to our 12-yard line.

Haines pounds center to our 12-yard line and fails to gain on right end. Gadd fails to gain on left end, but he goes over on right end. The play goes over and Charlotte gets a 15-yard penalty for taking too much time. Burroughs intercepts a pass on our 19-yard line.

Whitt fumbles, but the ball is recovered by one of our men. Lee's pass is incomplete followed by an 8-yard gain. Pittman takes the ball to our 40-yard line. Ogburn plunges through center for two yards. Lee fumbles and Gadd recovers the ball on our 47-yard line.

Haines and Gadd net 14 yards on two end runs. Morris runs out of bounds on our 18-yard line. Two end runs and a pass fail to net for Charlotte.

Greensboro's ball. Elias makes 33 yards on two right end runs and fumbles in the next play and the ball is recovered by Wrenn for a 5-yard gain. Elias dashes through center for 5 yards. Lee fails to gain. Greensboro is penalized 5 yards for lifting the ball out of bounds. Holding starts across the field to talk to the referee about it, but the referee penalizes us 15 yards for the coach being on the field. Elias gains five yards at tackle and Burroughs punts to Morris on our 33-yard line as the half is called.

Third quarter: Gadd kicks off to Rees who takes the ball to our 35-yard line. Lee gets 2 yards at center, but
